Somebody Cares Tampa Bay (SCTB) is a network of independent, community based non-profit agencies providing outreach support to Tampa Bay Ministries who assist poverty-stricken families and the working poor. SCTB works in concert with local ministries, churches, and businesses to provide the necessities of life and to educate and develop healthy, self-sustaining communities, families, and individuals.

Founded in 1997 by Daniel & Kathy Bernard, Somebody Cares Tampa Bay's desire is that the residents of Tampa Bay see a demonstration, not merely a presentation, of God's love for them as churches, ministries, and businesses work in unity to bring the necessities of life to the underprivileged. Practically, we can do much more together than we can do apart.

SCTB works in concert with local organizations and businesses in Pinellas, Hillsborough, and Pasco counties to provide the necessities of life and to develop healthy and self-sustaining communities and individuals. SCTB unites these organizations and coordinates efforts, maximizing the efficiency and effectiveness of resource distribution to best serve the underprivileged members of our community.

The largest program that Somebody Cares Tampa Bay organizes is **CareFest**®. This is a city-wide community service day. CareFest unites churches, businesses, organizations, and cities with the purpose of demonstrating love and caring in practical ways. We believe that those with a heart to serve are a gift to every community and as we serve our communities together, in love, we fulfill our duty as that gift.

Thousands of volunteers and hundreds of partners from city government, area churches, businesses and other non-profit ministries have been involved in CareFest on an annual basis. CareFest not only blesses the recipients of the services and the volunteers, but it serves to further unify the Tampa Bay area. This day of caring provides the additional and the benefit of introducing churches, businesses, ministries, and individuals to each other's work in the community.

The **SCTB Food Program** is a program designed to bring thousands of pounds of food into the Tampa Bay area to help feed the hungry. We receive truckloads of food and then distribute it to ministries who use the food to feed the hungry. With each Operation Blessing delivery, approximately 30,000 pounds of food is distributed through our expansive network of partnering organizations each month. One truckload of food can provide 1,920 families, or 7,680 individuals, with meals. This equates to feeding a minimum of 23,800 people per month, or 276,800 annually.

Through the **SCTB** "Hassle Free" Backpack Program many children are blessed all over the nation. The program is designed to free up time and resources for businesses, churches and other ministries who reach out to children with Back-to-School supplies. We do the leg work and provide the best possible value by bulk purchasing backpacks and supplies. We also service the homeless ministries, mission, outreaches, weekend feeding programs, and other school outreaches. Last year we helped to distribute over 13,000 backpacks to children all over the U.S.


