Founded in 1997 by Daniel & Kathy Bernard, Somebody Cares Tampa Bay's desire is that the residents of Tampa Bay see a demonstration, not merely a presentation, of God's love for them as churches, ministries, and businesses work in unity to bring the necessities of life to the underprivileged. Practically, we can do much more together than we can do apart.

SCTB works in concert with local organizations and businesses in Pinellas, Hillsborough, and Pasco counties to provide the necessities of life and to develop healthy and self-sustaining communities and individuals. SCTB unites these organizations and coordinates efforts, maximizing the efficiency and effectiveness of resource distribution to best serve the underprivileged members of our community.

The largest program that Somebody Cares Tampa Bay organizes is **CareFest®**. This is a city-wide community service day. CareFest unites churches, businesses, organizations, and cities with the purpose of demonstrating love and caring in practical ways. We believe that those with a heart to serve are a gift to every community and as we serve our communities together, in love, we fulfill our duty as that gift.

Thousands of volunteers and hundreds of partners from city government, area churches, businesses and other non-profit ministries have been involved in CareFest on an annual basis. CareFest not only blesses the recipients of the services and the volunteers, but it serves to further unify the Tampa Bay area. This day of caring provides the additional and the benefit of introducing churches, businesses, ministries, and individuals to each other's work in the community.

Through the **SCTB “Hassle Free” Backpack Program** many children are blessed all over the nation. The program is designed to free up time and resources for businesses, churches and other ministries who reach out to children with Back-to-School supplies. We do the leg work and provide the best possible value by bulk purchasing backpacks and supplies. Last year we helped to distribute over 3,000 backpacks to children all over the U.S.

Somebody Cares works ongoing with leadership throughout Tampa Bay to encourage and educate them so they can be the best leader. Quarterly meetings bring these leaders together for fellowship and encouragement.

When necessary **SCTB** is actively involved in disaster relief efforts. By networking they can assist ministries who are actively serving hard hit areas.

The newest program is **Faith & Family Month** in June. We emphasize the importance of the biblical family through church and community activities. Mayors throughout Florida continue to jump on board to proclaim Faith & Family Month.


